





Conference Speakers

Ron Althoff	Ron Althoff joined Saddle Butte in 2000 to promote cover crops throughout the Midwest. Previously, he managed a farm supply co-op for 16 years. He also worked for and later managed a large regional seed company specializing in turf, forage, soy, and wheat.
Hal Brown	Hal Brown and his son Ty raise corn and soybeans in central Indiana. They have been using cover crops for 8 years.
Kevin Burrus	After graduating from the University of Illinois in crop sciences in 2006, Kevin Burrus started working at Burrus Seed Farms as production manager in the Arenzville, Illinois, growing location. His family and Burrus Seed staff manage roughly 3,000 acres of seed corn annually and have worked at incorporating cover crops into the seed corn cycle as an effective tool to improve the land.
Cade Bushnell	Cade Bushnell farms 1,300 acres in northern Illinois and has been 100% no-till/strip-till since 1992. He returned to the family farm after receiving his bachelor's degree in horticulture from Iowa State University. His dad started no-tilling in the 1970s. Cade has been experimenting with cover crops for 6 years.
Joe Curless	As a young man, Joe Curless recalls applying cereal rye on the west central Illinois family farm to manage erosion. Today their ground has eroded significantly, so Joe has utilized his degrees in agronomy and precision ag to create a system to hopefully better manage their soils through cover crops. Joe currently manages the family farm in Astoria, Illinois, and assists in their aerial application business.
Barry Fisher	Barry Fisher serves on the Technology Staff for the Natural Resources Conservation Service in Indiana where he provides technical direction for Indiana Soil Health Strategy implementation and agronomic training and assistance to NRCS Field Offices. He also represents NRCS in the Conservation Cropping System Initiative.

Joel Gruver Doug Hanson	Joel Gruver is an assistant professor of soil science in the School of Agriculture at Western Illinois University. He is also the director of the WIU Organic Research Program and the WIU Cover Crop Innovator Project. Doug Hanson is a seed specialist for ProHarvest Seeds in Ashkum, Illinois. He and his wife Lisa have a cowcalf "MIG" operation on 80 acres of highly productive central Illinois soil. Doug works with cash crop and livestock producers to effectively utilize cover crops for agronomic benefits and as a feed source for
Jim Hoorman	livestock. Jim Hoorman is an assistant professor with Ohio State University Extension specializing in Cover Crops and Water Quality Putnam County, Ohio. He is currently working on a PhD in environmental sciences at Ohio State University. Jim owns a 40 acre farm with his wife Marlene and son Jonathan (12) where he is conducting cover crop research trials.
Chris Kamienski	Chris Kamienski is a weed management technology development representative for Monsanto in central and northern Illinois. His responsibilities include the development of new weed management technologies and product support. He has worked in a technical capacity in the agricultural industry for the past 10 years. He is a graduate of the University of Illinois with a bachelor's degree in crop sciences and a master's degree in weed sciences.
Wayne Kizer	Wayne Kizer is co-owner of KB Seed Solutions and manager of his family's fourth generation farm in Harrisburg, Oregon. He produces KB Royal Annual Ryegrass, Wheat, Fescue, Orchardgrass, Meadowfoam and Nitro Radish on their 1,400 acres. They also run a custom cleaning plant which processes over 10 million pounds of grass seed and produces over 5,000 tons of cattle feed yearly.


Mike Shuter Dave Stuzman	Mike Shuter is a corn, soybean, beef cattle, and hog producer from east central Indiana. Mike and his sons have been no-tilling for 30 years, strip-tilling for 10 years, and have been using variably rate technology as long as it has been available. For the last 5 years they have been researching cover crops and how to integrate them into their operation. In 2010 they started developing a machine to seed cover crops in standing corn and soybeans. Dave grew up in the Arthur, Illinois, area, working in his family's custom harvesting and tillage business. For the past 7 years he has been working with Mark Freed at Freed Farms in Lexington, Illinois, where he is always looking for ways to improve soil health, profitability, and sustainability on the land they farm.
Terry Taylor	Terry Taylor has been a continuous no-tiller for more than 20 years, using cover crops as part of his program. For the last 8 years, he has had the privilege of being a cooperator with Mike Plumer and has had the opportunity to observe his work close-up and to transfer some of the strategies developed there to his continuous no- till, continuous cover crop program.
Dan Towery	Dan Towery operates Ag Conservation Solutions from Lafayette, Indiana, where he focuses on no-till, cover crops, and soil health. Dan is also president of the Soil and Water Conservation Society.
Ralph Upton, Jr.	Jr. Upton has been growing cover crops on his 1,800 acre farm in southern Illinois since the mid-1980s. By working closely with Mike Plumer and others during the many years, Jr. has been very instrumental in the establishment of the fundamental parameters of cover cropping in southern Illinois.
Allen Williams	Allen Williams is a retired accountant and currently farms in Piatt and Macon Counties in Illinois. He has farmed a conventional operation since 1972 and a certified organic operation since 1994. He has utilized cover crops since 1972.
Paul Youngstrum	Paul Youngstrum is a resource conservationist on the area staff at Morris, Illinois. He assists NRCS staff in northeastern Illinois with the conservation planning of agronomic practices, such as nutrient management, animal waste utilization, cover crops, grazing management, no-till, prescribed burning, and more. 
