Buffalo Bill Museum

Welcome to the Wild West! Buffalo Bill Cody's exciting story as Pony Express rider, army scout, buffalo hunter and showman comes to life at the Buffalo Bill Museum & Grave, high atop Lookout Mountain. Enjoy views of the snowcapped Rockies in one direction, the Great Plains in the other. For those with strong nerves, drive to the museum on the hairpin Lariat Loop Drive ... then continue to I-70, exit 250, to see [a live herd of buffalo](#).

Colorado Railroad Museum

Surrounded by towering Western buttes, the Colorado Railroad Museum combines a spectacular location with more than 100 narrow and standard gauge locomotives, cabooses and cars. Exhibits include a working Roundhouse, model railroads, photographs and artifacts, much of it housed in a replica of an 1880s-style depot. Train rides every Saturday on the Galloping Goose take guests on a third of a mile loop of track, while "Steam ups" and special events including "A Day Out With Thomas" occur throughout the year.

Coors Stadium

"Behind the Seams" tours of Coors Field are available during the offseason and provide a behind-the-scenes look at one of the premier ballparks in Major League Baseball. All tours begin at Gate D (20th & Blake Street). Tours last 75-80 minutes and cover a distance of about one mile. All tours are accessible for guests with disabilities. Also, don't miss the Sandlot, a brewery in Coors Field that is open year-round.

OUTDOOR ADVENTURE

City Park

- In [City Park's](#) 330 lovely, landscaped acres, you'll find a [public golf course](#), colorful flower gardens, ornate fountains, placid lakes and rolling green lawns perfect for picnics. City Park is home to some of Denver's most popular attractions, including the [Denver Zoo](#), the [Denver Museum of Nature & Science](#), the Martin Luther King Memorial and much more. From June through August, the park plays host to City Park Jazz, with free concerts each Sunday. It's also got unbeatable views of The Mile High City skyline and the Rocky Mountains beyond.

Civic Center Park

Located in the heart of downtown Denver, [Civic Center Park](#) is always bursting with life, as tourists and locals take advantage of the beautiful landscaping and vibrant atmosphere of this unique urban park. Many events, such as Civic Center EATS (a food truck festival Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays in the summer months), the Capitol Hill People's Fair, and A Taste of Colorado are traditionally held in Civic Center Park. This spacious plaza, surrounded by monumental government and public buildings, is a stone's throw from a number of Mile High City attractions, including the [Denver Art Museum](#), the [Denver Public Library](#), the [16th Street Mall](#) and the [Colorado State Capitol Building](#).

Centennial Flower Gardens

Just steps away from [Elitch Gardens Theme & Water Park](#) and the South Platte River, the Centennial Flower Gardens are a must-see for anyone with interest in gardening. The gardens are patterned after the Gardens of Versailles, with paths and patterned flowerbeds showcasing native species along with other flowers that grow well in Colorado's arid climate. This is a great spot for a refreshing afternoon stroll.

Elitch Gardens Theme & Water Park

- If you are looking for thrill rides, or a water park to cool off from the summer heat, this is the place for you.

Commons Park

[Commons Park](#) can be found on the banks of the South Platte River in a spot that just happens to be the city's birthplace. It's a pleasing mix of natural and urban influences: Close to 40 percent of the park is covered by native plants, a piece of reconstructed lush "sand prairie" reminiscent of what would have existed in the area originally. Meanwhile, the promenade along Little Raven Street is a tree-lined walkway dotted with many seating areas and entries to connect the park to downtown Denver.

Washington Park

One of Denver's most popular spots year-round, [Washington Park](#) (nicknamed "Wash Park" by locals) features two lakes (boat rentals are available), flower gardens, innovative playgrounds and countless areas for outdoor recreation. Wash Park is also a favorite for its extensive sports and fitness options, including a recreation center with indoor pool, a bicycle/pedestrian pathway, a crushed granite jogging path, a fitness course, a horseshoe pit, a lawn bowling/croquet area, a soccer field and tennis courts.

Sunrise Vinyasa Yoga

- Practice your yoga skills before the natural beauty at Denver Botanic Gardens . In the warmer months (roughly April-October), the hour-long vinyasa classes take place outside in the Annuals Garden under the pavilion. The Annuals Garden is one of the attraction's most colorful gardens in the spring and summertime, making it a serene space to practice. With no music, it gives students the opportunity to tune into their breath and sounds of surrounding nature.
- The class invites all levels with postures that promote alignment, flexibility, focus and endurance, and help detoxify the body. Practitioners should bring their own mats and any props they want to use. Also offered: evening vinyasa in Mordecai Children's Garden, kundalini and, occasionally, bilingual yoga.

TOURS

Scootours Denver

- Tour Denver on a Vespa-style scooter! You'll start with a training session to learn how to ride, then head out on a two-hour guided tour. Each tour starts at the Blue Bear at the [Colorado Convention Center](#) — Denver's favorite piece of public art. From there, you'll cover several miles, stopping at some of the city's most popular tourist locations like [Coors Field](#), [Denver Union Station](#), the [Colorado State Capitol](#) and the [Molly Brown House Museum](#), and cruising through the Lower Downtown, Highlands, Cherry Creek and Washington Park neighborhoods. Along the way, you'll learn about Denver's history, architecture, art and more. After the tour, you can rent a scooter to keep exploring The Mile High City on your own. No motorcycle experience is necessary.

Denver Trolley

- Denver once had an extensive electric-rail system that covered the city and connected it with nearby Golden and Boulder. Trolley service was discontinued in 1950, but you can experience a little piece of history on Car No. 25, Denver's last remaining electric railway car. The Denver Trolley travels on the rails along the west bank of the South Platte River from Confluence Park (behind REI) to lower Colfax Avenue, stopping along the way at the [Downtown Aquarium](#), the [Children's Museum of Denver at Marsico Campus](#) and the Broncos Bridge across from [Empower Field at Mile High](#). A round-trip ride takes about 25 minutes and includes narration about Denver's history. The Denver Trolley runs Memorial Day weekend through Labor Day. All aboard!
