## FREE SERVICES

### Metroride

With limited stops between the bus concourse at Union Station and Civic Center Station along 18th and 19th streets, the Free MetroRide is the perfect option for downtown commuters. This free bus service runs during weekday rush hours (5:54 am – 9:18 am and 2:46 pm – 6:28 pm) and provides convenient connections to bus, light rail, and commuter rail. The Free MetroRide is a fast, reliable alternative and convenient companion to the 16th Street Free MallRide.

The Free MetroRide makes 14 stops during a round trip on 18th and 19th streets, traveling between Union Station and Civic Center Station. The stops markers are distinct from other RTD bus stops and have a white canopy and/or marker with a map of the route and downtown area.

## MallRide

Traveling from one end of Denver's bustling 16th Street Mall to the other, the Free MallRide runs seven days a week and stops on every block between Civic Center Station and Union Station. The Free MallRide starts running at 4:59 a.m. on weekdays, 5:30 a.m. on Saturdays and 6:30 a.m. on Sundays/holidays. Service continues throughout the day with the last complete round-trip of the night starting out at 1:19 a.m. from Union Station to Civic Center Station.

## PAID SERVICES

### Uber/Lyft


Uber and Lyft can both be downloaded from the app store on any mobile device. From there, you can put in your location and intended destination to receive a pricing rate for the ride.

This is best used going to/from the airport and when traveling longer distances within the city on a time crunch.

### Denver Airport Rail

For \$10.50, you can take the Regional Transportation District (RTD) University of Colorado A Line or RTD SkyRide bus service to downtown Denver. These two services provide transportation to and from Denver International Airport and direct access to airline check-in, baggage check, security screening, and baggage claim. The A Line brings you to various points in downtown Denver, and one of its most popular destinations is Union Station, in the heart of downtown Denver. The journey takes just 37 minutes, and trains depart every 15 minutes during peak travel times.

## Downtown Denver Bike Map



Google Maps has bicycle route data for the Denver area. Click the Layers icon to turn on the 'Bicycling' layer. Dedicated trails and bike paths are dark green, and roads with bike lanes of sharrows are shown as a brighter green. Paths with dashed lines are "bicycle-friendly" but may not have dedicated lanes.

To use the electric bike or scooter options, you must download the corresponding app to the bike or scooter you wish to use. The two options are Lime or Lyft. Once you have downloaded the app, there are step by step instructions to guide you.
