Soil and Water Conservation Delegation at One Water Summit

SWCS partnered with the National Association of Conservation Districts (NACD) and the National Association of State Conservation Agencies (NASCA) to convene a Soil and Water Conservation Delegation at the 2022 One Water Summit, September 13 through 15, 2022, in Milwaukee, Wisconsin.

One Water recognizes that an approach to water stewardship that is innovative, inclusive, and integrated is most successful. The One Water Summit included three days of solutions-focused conversations on how the nation can better value and manage water to foster economic prosperity, community well-being, and environmental sustainability. Thought-provoking workshops, institutes, site visits, and networking opportunities sparked dialogue and peer-exchange.




